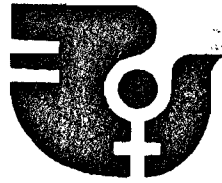

and Zaire: draft resolution

Participation of women in the seventh special session
of the United Nations General Assembly and in other
meetings of the different bodies of the United Nations

The World Conference of the International Women's Year,

Referring to General Assembly resolution 3010 (XXVII) of
18 December 1972,

Recalling the International Development Strategy for the Second
United Nations Development Decade (1970),

Bearing in mind the Declaration on the Elimination of
Discrimination against Women (1967),

Bearing in mind also the many resolutions of the Commission on the
Status of Women,

Noting the importance of the role of women in the establishment
of a new world economic order, in accordance with the Charter of the
Economic Rights and Duties of States,

Noting the limited extent of participation of women in international
meetings of major political and economic importance, such as the sixth
special session of the United Nations on raw materials and development,

1. Requests all Governments to ensure the participation of women
in the seventh special session of the United Nations General Assembly
on development and international co-operation;

2. Recommends that the delegations of countries to the different committees of the General Assembly and the various bodies of the United Nations should be comprised of men and women without discrimination;

3. Requests all Governments to take measures to ensure the full participation of women in decision-making at all levels in their countries and likewise requests them as well as the Secretary-General of the United Nations to do everything possible to bring about the actual promotion of women on a broader scale to posts of the highest responsibility within the United Nations system;

4. Recommends the inclusion in the agenda of the General Assembly, whenever appropriate, of an item relating to the status of women;

5. Urges the Secretary-General of the United Nations to take all necessary measures for the implementation of this resolution.
