INTERVENTION OF THE CENTRAL PEOPLE'S GOVERNMENT OF THE  
PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA IN KOREA

Lebanon: amendment to the joint draft resolution of Afghanistan, Burma, Egypt, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Lebanon, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Syria and Yemen (A/C.1/642)

The General Assembly,

Viewing with grave concern the situation in the Far East,

Considering that the continuance of the situation is likely to endanger the maintenance of world peace and security,

Recommends that if and when a cease-fire occurs in Korea, either as a result of a formal arrangement or, indeed, as a result of a lull in hostilities pending some such arrangement, the representatives of the following Governments, namely, . . . . . shall, upon the convocation of the President of the General Assembly, as soon as possible meet and make recommendations for the peaceful settlement of existing issues in accordance with the purposes and principles of the United Nations. The above-mentioned representatives shall be guided by the principles submitted in the supplementary report of the Group on Cease-Fire in Korea (document A/C.1/645).
