LETTER DATED 13 SEPTEMBER 1950 FROM THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UNION OF
SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL CONCERNING
NINE THOUSAND RESOLUTIONS RECEIVED BY THE CZECHOSLOVAK
COMMITTEE OF THE PARTISANS OF PEACE

New York, 13 September 1950

With reference to my letter No. 166 of 31 August, addressed to the Assistant Secretary-General in charge of Security Council Affairs and issued as Security Council document S/1753, concerning nine thousand resolutions received by the Czechoslovak Committee of the Partisans of Peace from various Czechoslovak organizations and institutions, I am forwarding you these resolutions, which have been addressed to the Security Council.

The resolutions express support of the proposals put forward in the Security Council concerning the peaceful settlement of the Korean question and contain protests against the aggression committed by the United States Government in Korea, against the barbarous bombings of peaceful cities and inhabited areas by the American Air Force and against the shelling of the peaceful population of Korea, from the air and from the sea.

I would ask you to include these resolutions in the list of letters and telegrams received by the Security Council.

Please issue this letter as a Security Council document.
