LETTER DATED 29 OCTOBER 1993 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF  
TOGO TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

COMMUNIQUE OF THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS

The Council of Ministers, meeting on Wednesday, 27 October 1993, under the chairmanship of the Head of State, General Gnassingbé EYADEMA and in the presence of the Prime Minister, Mr. Kokou Joseph KOFFIGO, considered the situation created in Burundi following the coup d'état of Thursday, 21 October 1993, during which the elected President of the Republic, Melchior Ndadaye, and some of his close collaborators were killed.

The Council of Ministers condemns this disruption of the democratic institutions which the people of Burundi had freely established.

It also condemns the massacre of the innocent civilian population and appeals to the putschists to restore power to the democratically elected institutions.

The Council of Ministers invites all the people of Burundi to show scrupulous respect for the verdict of the polls in a spirit of national unity and reconciliation and to put an end to the suffering and massacre of the population.
